To begin a career in real estate appraisal in Connecticut you must apply for a Provisional Real Estate Appraiser License

To Qualify

For a provisional license, you must complete at least **75 hours** of approved education, **60 of those hours** can be completed through these UConn courses:

UConn Courses

- FNCE 3334 Real Estate
 Markets and Valuation
- FNCE 3335 Commercial
 Real Estate Appraisal
- In addition to passing the optional Appraisal Institute Exam proctored by professors at the ed of each course

Next Steps

The other **15 hours** is a required Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (**USPAP**)

This course is offered each
Spring Semester as a two-day
seminar at no cost to students
who have passed at least of the
UConn courses

By taking the **two courses** (30+30=60), passing the **AI Exams** at the end of ech class, taking the **USPAP course** (+15) and passing the exam, you can **satisfy all the educational requirements** for a Provisional License while at UConn

Even if you do not intend to pursue a valuation career, satisfying the educational and exam criteria for a provisional license is a powerful mark of competency and education for employers
