Five UConn Student Teams Innovate Decarbonization This Summer Through Eversource-Supported Challenge

Through Eversource-Supported Challenge. The winning team will receive additional funding to continue their work throughout the academic year.

UConn is deepening its commitment to a sustainable future through a student-focused innovation challenge designed to reduce carbon emissions and promote clean energy solutions. In partnership with Eversource Energy, UConn has launched its third annual summer competition aimed at engaging students in the design of the future energy landscape.

The competition has attracted an impressive group of participants, with five finalist teams comprising 11 students – five undergraduates and six graduates. These talented individuals represent eight diverse departments and schools: the Department of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering, Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering, School of Civil and Environmental Engineering, and School of Computing in the College of Engineering; the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics in the College of Agriculture, Health and Natural Resources (CAHNR); the School of Business; and the Department of Chemistry and the Department of Mathematics in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

This multidisciplinary representation brings together diverse perspectives and technical expertise to address the complex challenges of decarbonization and the energy transition across UConn campuses and Connecticut municipalities.

Each team will receive summer funding and be paired with mentors from UConn faculty and Eversource Energy. The mentorship will support students in refining their proposals and addressing the practical dimensions of their clean energy solutions. This hands-on guidance is designed to help participants explore real-world applications of their research and ideas.

The culmination of the teams' work will be presented at the 2025 Sustainable Clean Energy Summit on Monday, Oct. 27, 2025. The event will take place alongside the 2025 North American Power Symposium, offering students a valuable platform to present their innovations to an audience of industry professionals, researchers, utility leaders and state officials.

PeoplesBank Arena set to reopen Oct. 17th after \$145M overhaul

Upgrades already draw more shows. Nearly five months after closing for a \$145 million renovation, Hartford's PeoplesBank Arena will reopen Oct. 17, when the Hartford Wolf Pack takes the ice.

At first glance, longtime fans may not see sweeping changes. The overhaul is largely focused on behind-the-scenes upgrades — premium spaces for VIPs and performers, new escalators and loading areas, and infrastructure designed to make the 50-year-old venue more attractive to touring acts.

Still, some improvements will be obvious.

The arena's 6,000 lower-bowl seats will have been replaced with padded chairs, the walls now sport fresh blue and gray paint, concourses will be modernized and the rebuilt stage has been pushed further back, freeing up about 1,000 more seats for concerts.

"The real magic is making this building work for the industry," said Michael Freimuth, executive director of the Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA), which oversees the arena. "That doesn't always translate to the guy sitting in the seat. He might say, 'How's it any different?' There's a lot of back-of-house stuff."

Booking momentum

Promoters are already responding. PeoplesBank Arena General Manager Ben Weiss said he has seen an increase in concert date holds.

"I've been here almost eight years, and this is the most interest we've had from artists, management or promoters that are putting holds on our calendar," Weiss said. "They are asking for date availability and putting holds on dates based on their tour schedule."

Historically, the arena averaged six to eight concerts each fiscal year. This year, despite losing the first quarter to construction, operator Oak View Group (OVG) expects at least 15 shows. In future years, Weiss said, the venue could host 25 to 30 concerts annually.

"The renovations, added premium seating, increased bookings — all of that will allow us to run the building in the black," Weiss said.

Entertainment promoter Live Nation has three shows coming up before the close of the year at the Hartford arena — as opposed to just one in all of 2024 — including Stevie Nicks on Oct. 25, Playboi Carti on Nov. 8 and Pentatonix on Dec. 6. Two of the events are nearly sold out.

Live Nation also booked a Mary J. Blige concert in May.

"Looking at ticket sales, it's very clear the public wants to go back to that venue," said Jim Koplik, Live Nation's president for Connecticut and upstate New York. "The interest is definitely much greater for people coming to the PeoplesBank Arena. We are seeing it."

UConn Avery Point Plans Potential Housing for Students

State senators advocated for housing accommodations and new academic programing for the University of Connecticut's Avery Point campus at a board of trustees meeting on Sept. 17.

Senators Cathy Osten (D), Heather Somers (R), and State Rep. Aundré Bumgardner (D), attended the meeting bringing attention to investment in Avery Point.

"I believe it's been neglected because it's on the eastern part of the state and often the eastern part of the state is an afterthought by many administrations, not just this current administration, but many administrations," Osten said in an interview with the Daily Campus.

Osten serves as the deputy president pro tempore and represents Columbia, Franklin, Hebron, Lebanon, Ledyard, Lisbon, Marlborough, Montville, Norwich and Sprague in Senate District 19.

With Osten's district bordering District 18, she has worked alongside Somers, working on shoreline east, state tourism and advocacy efforts for the Avery Point campus.

"I started advocating for the campus because it's an important component in Eastern Connecticut and it is one of the four regional campuses, but UConn Avery Point has been a part of the fabric of Eastern Connecticut for a very long time." Osten said. "It is a site that has value."

The Avery Point campus is located on the Long Island Sound. It offers four degrees in English, General Studies, Marine Sciences and Maritime Studies. The regional campus offers graduate programs in several STEM-related fields <u>as stated on its website</u>.

This campus is one of two campuses that do not currently have any on-campus housing options for students. "Traditionally, Avery Point students have rented housing in the region or commuted from their homes," UConn Spokesperson Stephanie Reitz said. "However, the availability of rental accommodations in the area has significantly dropped due to strong hiring at local industries, making it more difficult and expensive for Avery Point students to compete for rentals in the past few years."
